

RESPECT THE WATER



Swimming is not allowed anywhere along the canal.



If someone falls overboard, throw a life ring (not directly at them) and be mindful of their proximity to the boat's main propeller and bow thruster. Cut the engine immediately if in doubt.



Be alert when travelling through locks and, if there is a lock keeper present, follow his/her instructions without question. To steady the boat, loop mooring lines around the bollards and hold loosely. Never tie them.



Children should be supervised at all times and with even greater vigilance when travelling through locks.



We strongly advise all passengers to wear life jackets* while on deck, particularly when inside locks and when mooring where the risk of accidents is greater. Children and non-swimmers are also at greater risk.

IN THE EVENT OF AN ACCIDENT...

If you have an accident, please contact your departure base immediately and complete an Accident Form, which can be found at the back of the onboard Boat and Navigation Manual.

For serious injuries or life threatening situations, call the emergency services on 112.

YOUR SAFETY IS OUR TOP PRIORITY

Please read and abide by the following safety guidelines to reduce the risk of accidents and injury while on board. We want you and your crew have a safe and enjoyable holiday.

We recommend you nominate a captain who is responsible for the safety of the crew and can take charge in case of an emergency.



Boating under the influence of drink or drugs significantly increases the likelihood of accidents and is not allowed.



Please do not navigate after dark.



When driving, be alert and pay attention at all times. Always refer to the waterways map to identify water hazards such as weirs, shallows and bridges and pass them with caution.



Children under 16 are not allowed to operate the boat, unless an adult is closely supervising.
